COVID-19 Update

Westminster Canterbury Richmond is pleased with the progress our community is making to get back to something that looks and feels normal after 16 months of the pandemic. We should all feel confident that we are safe being vaccinated, but we need to continue to be aware that COVID-19 is still present in the broader community. The positivity rate in Henrico was 0.6% on June 18, which is outstanding. Today it is 2.3%, which is still good but is headed in the wrong direction. Please continue to be cautious. Do not lower your guard, especially around those who are not vaccinated.

On Monday, June 28, Westminster Canterbury Richmond learned that an unvaccinated Registered Nurse (RN) from Mary Morton Parsons Health Center First Floor had tested positive for COVID-19, placing Parsons Health Center First Floor West and East under quarantine. In great news, as of today, these hallways are out of quarantine. We found no other positive cases during our testing.

Vibrancy! and Other Construction Updates

Work continues on preparation for the Promenade and kitchen renovation. We are awaiting the permit to begin work for the new Parking Deck. The temporary parking lot for staff is under construction next to our existing staff parking lot at Cochrane Pond. This work will continue as we create a safe, connected parking area for use while the Parking Deck is being constructed on the current Parsons Health Center parking lot. In the coming weeks we will get a permit to proceed with the Parking Deck. At that time, the Parsons Health Center parking lot and Ellipse road and parking will close to allow for construction. We will provide more specific dates as soon as we have them.

Within the next week or so, the temporary black plastic wall in the Tower Lobby will be replaced with a more permanent wall where we will be display images and updates regarding the plans.
